**Important notes:** If your plant is a carnivorous plant, it will come with a cube of sphagnum moss, *not* a compost disc. This is because these plants need to grow in a lower nutrient medium. *Do NOT water or wash carnivorous plants with tap water, but use rain water, filtered water or distilled water instead.*

*Please remember that the plants need exposure to light: if you have bought it as a present, do not wrap long in advance!*

# So easy to grow

- 1** Remove your kit from the packaging, open biome and remove bagged plantlet.
- 2** Place compost disc or moss cube (see note on reverse) into the biome base, add warm water (see note on reverse for carnivorous plants) and watch the compost expand.
- 3** Remove plantlets from bag and gently wash off all the gel with warm water (see note on reverse for carnivorous plants). Be careful of the young plant! Gently make a hole in the compost and place the plantlet roots in the hole, making sure you cover the roots with compost / moss and firm down with your fingers.
- 4** Cover the biome base with the biome dome. Place biome in bright, indirect light away from strong sources of heat or cold draughts.
- 5** For the first three weeks leave closed. After three weeks, gradually open the vent at the top of the biome, a little more each day over the course of the following week; ensure compost is kept moist at all times.
- 6** Watch your plantlet start to grow! After about a month, the plant may be removed from the biome and potted on. Your biome is now ready to be used again. See our website for details of the other plants we do ([www.tomorrowgarden.eu](http://www.tomorrowgarden.eu))
- 7** Don't forget to wash your hands after touching the growing gel and the compost / moss.
